#### 9.35 – 9.50 David Van Reybrouck

David Van Reybrouck is a pioneering advocate of participatory democracy. He founded the G1000 Citizens' Summit, and his work has led to trials in participatory democracy throughout the Netherlands, Belgium and France. He is also one of the most highly regarded literary and political writers of his generation and the author of *Congo: The Epic History of a People*, which won 19 prizes and has been translated into a dozen languages.

## 9.50 – 10.05 Sarah Monaghan

Sarah Monaghan is a widely known spokesperson and head of communications for the "Together for Yes Campaign" in the referendum that led to the legalization of abortion in Ireland in 2018. Sarah was responsible for the successful mobilization of villages and towns across Ireland, creating regional groups and collaborative cells. Currently, she is the manager of the so-called "Consent project", which continues to work on protecting the rights of raped and molested women.

Jerry Lieberman is the co-founder and secretary/treasurer of the international Evolution Institute in the US. He is the initiator of the 'quality of life' project and organizer of numerous educational and research initiatives to strengthen democratization processes in the US and Europe.

Erik Solheim is the former Norwegian Minister of International Development and Minister of the Environment (2005-2012) in the coalition government formed by the Labour Party, Norwegian Center Party and the Socialist Left Party. He also served as Under-Secretary-General of the United Nations and Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Programme (2016 to 2018).

## 13.00 - 13.10 Bartłomiej Nowotarski

Constitutionalist lawyer. He specializes in the processes of democratization of countries, with particular emphasis on the opportunities of Muslim countries. He is a member of the German Marshall Fund and co-founder of the Polish Institute for Islamic Studies and the Civic Knowledge Association. Project co-author: The Small Constitution (1992) and the electoral law for both chambers of the Polish parliament, which is still in force. He also worked on laws on political parties and their financing. He was the chairman of the Political Council of the Democratic Party.

Radoslaw Markowski - professor of political science, Center for the Study of Democracy, at SWPS UNiversity & Polish Academy of Sciences. Political Science Ass. (APSA) prize in 2000 and sociological Stefan Nowak prize in 2007.

Sociologist, civil society researcher, scholarship holder at Yale University. In the past, an activist of the Solidarity movement. Co-founder of the Civic Fund. Currently, the President of the Shipyard Foundation, which, among many completed participatory processes (including consultations, meetings and civic hearings), last year organized the first nationwide civic panel in the country.

Hubert Tadych is a representative of the Polish branch of the European Democracy Youth Network, where he is responsible for external relations in the rank of Partnership Officer. He was vice-president of the European Democrat Students and an expert of the European Youth Forum. Professionally a lawyer and advocate trainee. He worked in the European Parliament and in the European Committee of the Regions. A graduate of the MBA program in the field of energy and climate.
